

Students have enjoyed volunteering at the Thrift Store with Brenda. We look forward to spending more time helping again in the new year!





This past month students have been engaging in a






Adventure Club!

December's Adventure Club went to the Hosmer Mine Ruins. Hosmer was settled in 1906 and by 1908 Hosmer Mines Ltd (a subsidiary of the CPR's Pacific Coal Company) was established. Along the trail we were hoping to see the remnants of the powerhouse, compressor house, lamp house and, at the end of the trail, the tunnels themselves and the fan house that pushed fresh air into the mine tunnels. Along another trail there is an old cemetery and the ruins from the coke ovens.

We had fun exploring the powerhouse and compressor house at the base of the hill then walked up the old rail line to see the lamp house. Unfortunately, due to time constraints, we couldn't see the old cemetery, coke ovens, tunnels, or fan house. We're hoping to go back in the Spring!



We recommend to use a <u>Laptop</u> or <u>Desktop Computer</u> to initialize your account. **Pop Ups** should be **enabled** for some features of the site to work properly.





Passwords must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Minimum length is 8
- ✓ At least one number
- ✓ At least one capital letter
- ✓ At least one lowercase letter
- At least one symbol that isn't a letter or number
- Cannot contain login name, first name, middle name, last name, date of birth, personal id, or only sequential letters or numbers.
