May is another busy month please note the following dates:


The week of May 1st we will be honouring MMIWG2S - Missing Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit People

press, accessory work, core and body weight exercises). PHE students have been working hard, developing their active living skills and understanding. This was also


a milestone year for school ski trips, the final school wide trip brought the biggest group going up to Fernie Alpine Ski Resort, with over 80 students.
