
Staff Spotlight




PHE and Socials with Mr. Gulyas

We recommend to use a <u>Laptop</u> or <u>Desktop Computer</u> to initialize your account. Pop Ups should be enabled for some features of the site to work properly.





Passwords must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Minimum length is 8
- ✓ At least one number
- ✓ At least one capital letter
- ✓ At least one lowercase letter
- ✓ At least one symbol that isn't a letter or number
- Cannot contain login name, first name, middle name, last name, date of birth, personal id, or only sequential letters or numbers.
