Indigenous Education

Welcome back to another exciting year at Elkford Secondary School. The Indigenous program at ESS is for all students who identify themselves as being of Indigenous Ancestry. All students with Indigenous Ancestors are eligible for Support Services through the Indigenous Program. Examples of support: advocacy, communicating between home and school, classroom presentations, educational trips and student support.

Every year students with Indigenous Ancestry have not identified themselves as Indigenous because they mistakenly believe they need Status or Metis card. This is not the case. If you believe that you or your children have Indigenous Ancestry your word is all that is required. Please share this information with others to help ensure all Indigenous students receive support.

Welcome to the land of the Ktunaxa



Circle - The circle is meant to symbolize the "Community/Family Support and Protection surrounding the student".

Smaller Circles - The smaller circles symbolize the four directions, the four senses of self (mental, spiritual, emotional and physical) and the four elements. Bringing a sense of balance to the student. The bottom circle depicts Earth, the top circle Air, the right circle Fire and the left circle depicts Water.

Tree - The tree inside of the student is meant to represent personal growth, with the roots anchored to show a sense of being "grounded" in self and culture.

Feathers - The feathers are meant to represent the Elders/Traditional/Ancestral Knowledge.

Inukshuk - The Inukshuk symbol is meant to acknowledge our Inuit students and families.

Infinity Sign - The Infinity symbol is meant to acknowledge our Metis students and families.

The student - The student's head, the heart and the earth symbol/roots are connected to one another. The heart holds a "fire of determination and purpose".

Sun and Mountain Range - The Sun represents a New Beginning, Hope and a lit Path moving forward. The Mountain Range is to give a sense of the Kootenay area.

Teacher Reports

Ms. Diamond


Right now in English, we are working on short story units. Students are reading and analysing short stories written by many different authors with different perspectives. The grade 12s read nonfiction articles as well. The grade 7s absolutely love reading and this is something that we do every day outside of take 15 as well. The grade 7s continue working on spelling and grammar as well as reading short stories.

Mr. Sanford

We have hit the ground running in Senior Social Studies this year. Every class started off the year by looking at the causes and consequences of wildfires in B.C. The Grade 9's transitioned into learning about Canadian Confederation, starting with the Seven Years' War. The Grade 10's have been learning about how the Canadian Government works and the roles and responsibilities of a government in creating a functional democracy. The Grade 11's have started our unit on World War II by looking at the rise of Fascism and Communism in Europe during the 1920's and 1930's. They have been analyzing how social, economic, and political hardships allow for radical ideologies to take root.

Mrs. Plamondon

In social 7 students learn about ancient civilizations. In our current unit, students have been learning about how early humans lived. This included learning about Otzi the iceman, a 5300 year old ice mummy found in the Alps in 1991. Students got the chance to speak with an archeologist from a museum in Bolzano, Italy where the ice man is kept. They had great questions about the mummy and artifacts found with him. They got to see replicas and pictures of the actual artifacts found in the Alps and the mummy. This was a fantastic opportunity to learn from experts that study the ice man every day."





Book Nook

Initial Log In



We recommend to use a **Laptop** or **Desktop Computer** to initialize your account.

Pop Ups should be **enabled** for some features of the site to work properly.

Login to MYEDBC: <https://www.myeducation.gov.bc.ca/asp/en/logon.do>

Family Portal Login ID: **sd5-firstinitiallastname** (all lower case)

1. Enter your **Login ID**
2. Enter your **Password** (Case Sensitive)
3. Click **Log On**

1. Current Password – enter the temporary password

2. New Password – enter the new user created password

3. Confirm New Password – enter the new user created password a second time

Passwords are good for 90 days to protect your child's data and you will be prompted to change your password.

Passwords must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ Minimum length is **8**
- ✓ At least one **number**
- ✓ At least one **capital letter**
- ✓ At least one **lowercase letter**
- ✓ At least one **symbol** that isn't a letter or number
- ✓ Cannot contain login name, first name, middle name, last name, date of birth, personal id, or only sequential letters or numbers.

Security Preferences Update

To enable self serve password recovery, please provide the following information

1. Enter your **Primary Email address**. This email address will be used to receive a new password if you forget your password.
2. Choose a **Security Question**
3. Enter your **Security Answer** then confirm your security answer. (Case Sensitive)
4. Click **Submit**

This will allow you to use the '**I forgot my password**' function on the logon page, should you need to reset your password.
