Here's a little collection of activities the whole family can enjoy when the weather isn't as cooperative as we'd like, or at any time at all!

From the Youth Care Room

Keep It Moving/"Keepy Uppy"

A classic balloon game (made famous in the TV show 'Bluey') is perfect for indoors with one or more children. The aim is to simply keep the balloon in the air and not let it touch the ground.

Be sure to have enough space, free from fragile items and tripping hazards. This is also a great time to play loud, hilarious party music.

Balloon Races

Set up some string/fishing line/yarn from one side of the room to the other, with a straw on the string. You could tie one end to a chair back and the other end to a railing, for example. Blow up a balloon, pinch the end tight and tape it to the straw then let the balloon go! Race two or more balloons, or time one to see how fast it goes. Can you make it go faster the next time?

Make a Science Fair

Setting up a science fair at home can be both fun and educational to keep kids learning. It encourages them to ask questions, conduct experiments, and present their findings.

To set up a home science fair, choose a theme or a topic of interest, do some research to organize the necessary supplies and materials, and design experiments your child can conduct. Let them document their findings and create a display board to showcase their project. This creates a love for science and helps develop valuable research, analysis, and presentation skills. Plus, it's an opportunity for the whole family to be involved and learn together.

Build a Fort

Building a fort using blankets, pillows, and furniture promotes teamwork, problem-solving, and spatial awareness skills. It's a playful escape from the typical games.


Setting up a fort is easy: gather blankets, cushions, and a sturdy foundation like a sofa or chairs. With the proper setup, a fort becomes a portal to exciting worlds, offering a space for storytelling, reading, or simply unwinding.

Family Talent Show

A family talent show is an entertaining and heartwarming way for every member to display their unique skills and hobbies, all while celebrating each other's talents.

To get started, designate a stage area in your living room or any open space, and invite family members to participate by preparing their performances. Everyone can join in the fun, whether it's singing, dancing, telling jokes, playing a musical instrument, or any other particular skill. Create a judging panel or simply applaud each act's effort, promoting a supportive and encouraging atmosphere. It's a fun and creative indoor activity that ensures everyone's talents are celebrated and cherished, making it an evening to remember.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

School District No. 5 (Southeast Kootenay) welcomes all children born between January 1, 2019, and December 31, 2019, and encourages parents to register their children at their catchment area school for September 2024 kindergarten entry. Registration and enrolment application forms shall only be accepted by the catchment area school commencing on Thursday, February 1, 2024, at 8:30 a.m.

School District No. 5 (Southeast Kootenay) provides all students with a warm and caring learning environment. We offer our kindergarten students a developmentally appropriate program along with access to computer technology, a Fine Arts program and student services support. French Immersion kindergarten is available at T.M. Roberts Elementary School.

School District No. 5 (Southeast Kootenay) will continue to use the online registration option for kindergarten students. A registration link will be posted on the District and elementary school websites.

Please do not complete an online application for children that have been enrolled in StrongStart programs in the province. If your child has been enrolled or is currently enrolled in a local StrongStart, they will be automatically enrolled in their catchment school. Please contact your catchment school directly to confirm registration. If you are unsure which school is your catchment area school, please visit the <u>school locator</u> on our district website.

All registrations will be dealt with on a first-come, first-serve basis. A birth certificate or other legally acceptable document, along with proof of B.C. residency (i.e., mortgage statement, rental agreement, or utility bill) must be provided at the time of registration. Registrations will not be completed until such documentation is made available.

Please register early to ensure your child can attend your catchment area school. Parents who wish their child to attend a school outside their catchment area are required to first register their child at their catchment area school. To request a transfer, pick up a "Family Request for Student Placement Form" from your catchment area school or <u>download</u> the form and return it to the School Board Office. Board Office staff will only begin to accept these completed forms on Thursday, February 1, 2024. Forms can be submitted via email to <u>studenttransfers@sd5.bc.ca</u>. Please refer to <u>Administrative Procedure 300</u> for more information.


Wear your pink shirt, show your support! Wednesday, February 28

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In 2007, Berwick Nova Scotia, after a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two grade 12 students bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise most students arrived wearing pink! With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born.

In recognition of the Berwick event, Nova Scotia proclaimed the second Thursday of September "Stand Up Against Bullying Day." In 2008, British Columbia proclaimed February 27th to be the provincial anti-bullying day, and the movement has continued to grow. In 2012, the United Nations declared May 4 as Anti-Bullying Day, and now the last Wednesday each February is Canada's national Pink Shirt/anti-bullying day.

Many countries now recognize specific days for raising awareness about the prevention of bullying and promoting kindness and inclusion. In Canada, many students have heard the Pink Shirt Day message from kindergarten through to their high school graduation. The movement continues to grow!





"Resilience" has become a common word heard around schools and seems to be a big focus for both educators and parents. While we understand the importance of helping our children build emotional strength in the face of adversity, it is sometimes less obvious how to teach those critical skills.

STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY 2023/2024

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2024** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades _____ and ___, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 3rd.
