

# Principal's Message



Once we get over the excitement of starting a new school year in September, October is the month when we settle in to our routines and rhythms of the school. It is also a time when we revisit our School Goals. Last year we began our first year of a three year overall goal to focus on Social Emotional Learning. As part of this goal last year, we focused on the practice of **gratitude**. This year we will be focusing on **belonging**. We know from research that academic performance and motivation is correlated with feelings of belonging at school and we want all of our students, staff and parents to feel like they belong at ÉIDES.

Parents are invited to joins us as we honour our veterans and remember the sacrifices made for us.

# Notes From Our Office

### Weather

Now that the cooler and wetter fall weather is here, it's a good time to remind students to dress appropriately for the weather as we still embrace the outdoors for mornings, recess and lunch throughout the fall and winter. It is our policy to stay outdoors unless the temperature is -20° Celsius or colder. Rainy days also don't stop us from going outside, so please make sure your child has raingear and waterproof boots. Of course monsoon rains and the wind chill factor will be taken into consideration and keeping students indoors will be at the discretion of the Principal. When cold weather persists for several days, we do allow the children to stay in, but will send them out for 15-20 minutes only, just so they get a little fresh air and exercise. We find that students become very restless if they stay in too often.

PLEASE DO NOT send ANY product to school that contains peanuts or nuts. ÉIDES has several children and staff who have a severe life-threatening food allergy (anaphylaxis) to peanuts and nuts, which can cause a severe reaction to specific foods and can result in death within minutes.

# **Crosswalk Safety**

The new crosswalk lights have been installed on 13th street and it has caused some confusion for students and drivers which has us concerned for the safety of pedestrians. Parents please help us to teach our students to use the crosswalk safely. They have been taught to push the crosswalk button, wait until the lights are flashing and all cars in the area have stopped before crossing. Parents can help reinforce this by **modelling** these steps every time you use the crosswalk. If you are driving please do not wave a child through the crosswalk. We want them to go when they feel safe based on the flashing lights and stopped cars.

Just a reminder as well that it is a 30 km/hour zone around the school.



# **School Clothing Orders**

We often get way more sugary treats than we like. Also, we ask that candy from Trick-or-Treating stays at home and is not sent in lunches for school.



Students from Japan, Spain, Mexico, Australia and Germany, will be studying in Grades 8 to 12 at Fernie and Sparwood Secondary Schools for between 3 months and one school year (10 months).

Host families come in all shapes and sizes from nuclear families with school-aged children to retired couples and single parents. Host families receive a reimbursement of \$750 per month per student and weekend and/or vacation coverage is available.

Hosting international students is a rewarding opportunity to make lifelong friendships reaching across oceans. Placements for students arriving in September are arranged in June, so please contact us right away to get involved.


