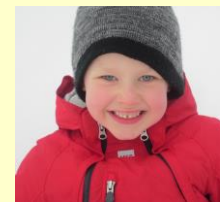

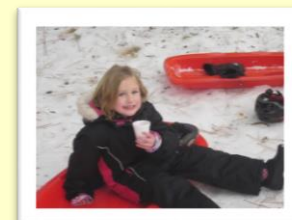
Thank you to Mrs. Romanick for organizing our Campbell's Soup Labels.

How to Teach Children to Accept Responsibility for Their Actions. Encourage your children to stop the blame game and start to accept responsibility.

The following tips will help your children to learn how to be accountable for their actions:

- **Connect the Dots.** Help your children to make the link between actions and consequences. The more experience your children get identifying causes and effects, the easier it will be for them to work through this inner dialogue before and after their own actions. For example, "Since I jumped in the puddle, my shoes are soggy."
- **Make Honesty Easy.** If you want your children to come to you with the truth (or admit to it when asked), try to keep your cool when expressing your dissatisfaction about their poor behaviour. Be calm and approachable. Let your children know that everyone makes mistakes and that what matters most is that they are truthful, learn from the situation and that they try to right their wrongs. It is also important to praise your children's honesty when they own up to their actions.
- **Stick to the Rules.** Children need to be accountable. They need to learn to accept the consequences of their words, actions and decisions. The only way children can do this is if you are consistent with rules and discipline.
- **Keep Track of Progress.** To help the lessons stick, turn it into a challenge. Tell your children that they will begin the week with 5 points and each time they make an excuse or try to place blame on others, they lose one point. Use a chart on the fridge or a dry erase board to keep track. If they can make it through the week without getting to zero, reward the improved behaviour with a trip to the park or an extra 30 minutes before bed one night. The chart will help to remind your children to be conscious of what they do and say.

Pinewood Dress Code

With the warmer weather approaching, we want to remind all students and parents of the Pinewood Dress Code. To maintain a school atmosphere that focuses on teaching and learning, Pinewood has developed a dress code requiring students and staff to be covered from neck to knees. The following are guidelines of the dress code:

1. No exposed midriffs
2. All tops and dresses must have straps. These straps must be three fingers wide
3. No hats, bandannas, or other headgear indoors
4. No clothing with logos or pictures with vulgarity, profanity, alcohol, drugs, sex, violence or hatred
5. No low cut tops, halter tops, backless tops, see-through tops or tube tops
6. No exposed underwear
7. No muscle shirts
8. Length of skirts and dresses must meet the fingertip rule (With your hands at your side, the length of the dress must be at least to your fingertips)
9. No clothing which allows underwear to be exposed
