9.1 Draft Policy – Application of Pesticides to District Buildings or Grounds

- Trustee Johns gave a brief background review of the draft policy.
- Patti Moore, Health Promotion Coordinator from the Canadian Cancer Society, gave a brief presentation which included the following points:
 - o Expressed concerns that the draft policy does not restrict use of pesticides on playgrounds/ use of pesticides for cosmetic purposes
 - o Sample policies from other districts that have banned the use of pesticides (#8, #36 and #83, #19 is currently considering a policy) have previously been shared with the district.
 - o Two BC universities have policies (UBC and UNBC)
 - o Interior Health has policy
 - o Both adult and childhood cancers have been linked to pesticides (children are at a higher risk to do their immature immune systems and close contact to the grass)
 - 168 Municipalities in Canada have adopted bylaws (31 of those are in BC and include Invermere, Fernie (next year), Nelson and Kimberley)
 - o Will provide an information package to Trustees/District Management
- Mr. Walkley described the integrated plan (set out by provincial ministry). The District has set out its own practice which includes informing schools why and when spraying occurs and no spraying on school days. The use of pesticides is decreasing year by year.

Alternative/natural measures are being looked. He has talked to some of the other school districts who are currently using alternative methods and they are not being very successful at this point. Knapweed and thistle (i.e. noxious weeds) are not considered cosmetic.

- Dr. James Heilman, a local physician, cited various studies connecting pesticides with cancer (copies of studies are attached)
- Needs to be more research done with all partner groups involved.

Committee Action A

"The Draft Policy - Application of Pesticides to District Buildings or Grounds be tabled."

Recommendation B

"That the Board of Education establishes a committee consisting of school board members and stakeholders to further research and discuss the Draft Policy – Application of Pesticides to District Buildings or Grounds."
