












BC Family Literacy week is January 21th-January 28th.


In celebration of Literacy Week, we invite students to participate in a Book Swap!! Students can bring in books they have already read and swap them for something new to read.


KO Sledding Hill




Games will commence on Tuesday, January 30th. A schedule will be provided once available. Parents will be responsible for driving students to and from games.

The Grade 4, 5 and 6 classes are FUNDRAISING for Science Fair Costs by organizing this first ever program at KO called Created by Kids.






