Item 6.3 Principal's Report

- a) Superstore Gift Card fundraiser has begun. Cost is dollar-for-dollar to buy cards. Fifteen percent of money spent on gift cards goes directly to our school, and more specifically to your child's own electives/sports/interests (eg. Band trip, Girls' soccer team, Harry Potter trip) Began with \$20K; down to \$14K available. A wonderful way to raise money for the school. Currently only cash is being accepted in exchange for the cards. Many teachers have been in support of this campaign with funds allocated to the general school account (recently purchased coats & shoes for kids in need). Setting a goal of selling \$20K in gift cards each month.
- b) Report cards are due February 8th & will be sent home February 15th
- c) In the midst of the last few weeks of basketball (Grade 8 will run an extra 2 weeks due to a late start). Upcoming soccer (girls); track to follow. Middle school track meet has been booked.
- d) School catchment boundary changes have been made official; this will be a great help to increase numbers at Laurie. Currently around 380 students; hopefully will have 420-430 for next year. This will increase class sizes on average from 18 students to 20 per class.
 - i) More students means we will be able to have more electives to choose from; administration will work with staff to develop/implement new electives (eg. Creative writing, S.T.E.A.M., French 9)
 - ii) Mr. Thorn & Mr. Doll are collaborating & hope to create a completely new social studies course focusing on Indigenous history & affects. They will try to develop a course with the permission (and hopeful collaboration) of local indigenous leaders.
- e) Activity Day February 27th: Bussing has been arranged; signup sheets will be in homerooms this week. Activities will include skiing, tobogganing, ice fishing & swimming at Fairmont (Fairmont will be a \$10 charge).
- f) Decent used clothing is being gladly accepted to the Laurie school "Boutique" run by Theresa Burman. Clothing goes to kids who need it.
- g) Busses are back on line & able to travel to Alberta overnight after some problems through the last year.
