


4. Pick two careers that interest you the most:

2. Once you have created your account, access the Student Transcript Services and select which post secondary institutes you wish to send your transcripts to. Remember there is no harm in selecting a large number of schools (even if you don't think you will be going to a school in the fall). You may change your plans before September and if you have selected all possible options the school or institute you finally decide to attend will have access to your transcripts at no charge to yourself.
