## "Emerging or Insufficient Evidence IE" in Grade 9 Core Classes / Online

- Statistics show if you are not passing at grade level you will struggle to pass at Mount Baker.
- Options if you have "emerging or IE" in all core classes (English, Science, Socials, and Math):
- Kootenay Educational Services - our alternate school
- Still a Mount Baker student but attend a different building
- Can have a blended timetable - Do core classes at KES, for a slower more self-paced program and attend Mount Baker for electives

## Graduation is a 3 Year Plan

- Each course is worth 4 credits
- Full timetable in one year = 32 credits
- Students need 80 credits to graduate
- One Fine Arts or Applied Skills course (4 credits) is required by graduation (these courses are listed in our course selection booklet)

## Grade 10 Course Requirements

- 6 courses are required at the Grade 10 level

1. Either:

- English First Peoples - Literary Studies PLUS Writing or Spoken Language or New Media OR
- English 10 - Literary Studies PLUS Composition or New Media or Spoken Language

2. Workplace Math 10 or Foundations of Math and Pre-Calculus 10
3. Social Studies 10
4. Science 10
5. Physical and Health Education 10
6. Career Life Education 10 (building block for Career Life Connections 12)

- Plus students must select 2 electives
- Special Cases:
- Students in Band (an elective) choose one more elective.
- Students in French Immersion (FRAL is an elective) choose one more elective.
- Students in French Immersion and Band do not choose another elective.
- Plus Numeracy and Literacy Assessments



## Grade 11 Course

 Requirements- 4 courses are required at the Grade 11 level

1. Either:

## Grade 11 Course Requirements (Cont'd)

4. Social Studies 11 or $\mathbf{1 2}$ (one of):

- $20^{\text {th }}$ Century World History 12
- BC First Peoples 12
- Contemporary Indigenous Studies 12
- Comparative Cultures 12
- Political Studies 12
- Physical Geography 12
- Law Studies 12
- Social Justice 12
- Philosophy 12
- Explorations in Social Studies 11
- PLUS: 4 elective courses (any course, academic or not, for which students have the prerequisite).
- 2 courses are required courses at the Grade 12 level:

1. English First Peoples 12 or English Studies 12
2. Career Life Connections 12

- 2 credits - assignments portion
- 2 credits - capstone project
- Typically, the 2 credit assignments portion is completed in Grade 11 outside the timetable OR the entire 4 credit course can be taken in timetable in Grade 12
- PLUS: Two additional Grade 12 courses for a total of 16 Grade 12 credits ( 4 courses)
- PLUS: One Indigenous focused course during your grade 10-12 years
