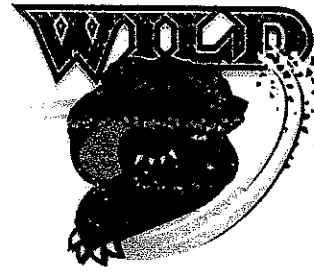


MOUNT BAKER EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS



STUDENT-ATHLETE'S CODE OF CONDUCT

The actions of a student-athlete are a reflection of themselves, their team, their school and their community. A student's involvement in school sport provides opportunities and experiences that are important to the development of a well-rounded student. However, student-athletes must remember that their participation in school sport is a privilege, not a right.

In registering as an Athlete member (all types) and within the context of the activities of Athletics an individual agrees to take part in a spirit of fair play, honesty and with the rules and regulations of BC School Sports Athletics. As such the student-athlete member is expected to:

Treat Everyone with Respect

- a) treat teammates, coaches, opponents, event organizers, spectators and others associated with athletics in a courteous and respectful manner
- b) respect and accept with dignity the decisions of officials
- c) be generous in winning and graceful in losing
- d) act in a manner that will bring credit to the athletics community and yourself both within and outside the competition arena and/or competition area

Exercise Self-control at All Times

- a) remember that there is no place in sport for drugs or alcohol, avoid the use, advocating, condoning, promotion and distribution of banned substances
- b) refrain from using tobacco products within the competition arena and/or competition area
- c) refrain from using alcohol at athletic events (athletics and other sport activities) or in victory celebrations at or near the competition site
- d) avoid providing alcohol to under age individuals
- e) refrain from the use of foul, profane, insulting, harassing or otherwise offensive language in the context of the activities of athletics
- f) ensure the safety of others when taking part in your athletics activity by refraining from the use of physical force outside of the rules of the game

Play Fair

- a) compete and participate in a spirit of fair play and honesty
- b) compete and participate within the rules and the spirit of the game at all times.

Failure to comply with the above may result in temporary and/or permanent suspension from some or all athletics promoted and offered at Mount Baker Secondary School.

CONSENT FORM



Extra-Curricular Program: _____

The Board of School Trustees believes that co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are an integral part of a student's education. Both co-curricular and extra-curricular refer to those activities that include day trips and overnight trips that extend beyond the regular instructional day and/or natural extension thereof. The Board of School Trustees therefore encourages and supports co-curricular and extra-curricular school trips as a viable method of enriching the learning situation for students, to develop the student's sense of social responsibility and to develop the student's physical well-being.

AUTHORIZATION:

Authorization at the School level (the Principal/Vice-Principal)

- The co-curricular or extra-curricular school trip is within the boundaries of the school district of British Columbia or Alberta or the states of Washington, Idaho or Montana.

SUPERVISION:

All co-curricular and extra-curricular school trips must have at least one responsible adult who has undergone a criminal record check and successfully completed the orientation program under the auspices of the School District. This person is responsible for the safe conduct of the students involved in the activity. The target student adult ratio for the co-curricular or extra-curricular trips is 15 students or portion thereof for every one adult (i.e. 15 to 1, 16 to 2).

For co-ed student overnight trips, adult supervision will consist of one male and one female person. For non co-ed, student overnight trips the adult supervision will consist of at least one person of the same gender as the teams members.

Accidents can be the result of the nature of the activity and can occur with or without any fault on either the part of the student, or the school board or its employees or agents, or the facility where the activity is taking place. By allowing your son/daughter to participate in this activity, you are accepting the risk of an accident occurring, and agree that this activity is suitable for your child.

The school district does not provide any accidental death, disability, dismemberment or medical expenses insurance on behalf of students.
