- Students can save and print their portfolios until Grade 12– waiting on next step to see how they can access it in the future

Update from the Director of Instruction/HR

Human Resources to date has filled 155 teaching and 115 CUPE positions for the current school year. The Education Fund positions are now posted and many are already filled.

We had a very successful first day together on October 21 for the new teacher mentorship program. Mentors and Mentees spent the day learning and planning their strategies for increased capacity within the classroom. The program has been well received to date and is a jointly funded project between the CFTA and the Board of Education. We are very excited about this new project!

The District Health and Safety team met last week. The team is set to meet quarterly to review district health safety concerns/issues and to monitor/support school health and safety teams with their work in schools.

Update from the District Principal/Student Services

Darcy Verbeurgt attended the Health Promoting School Coordinator's Education Sessions in Kelowna in mid-October. The main focus of the education session was physical literacy and movement for the sake of the body and mind. A number of HPSCs presented on initiatives in their Districts and how this work fits with the model of Comprehensive School Health.

Along the health theme, there is a new semi-annual discussion between school district and Interior Health leadership staffs to share information around current issues. The October teleconference discussed immunizations, condoms in schools, the fentanyl crisis, and needles on school grounds. This information was sent on to principals and district safety staff.

A number of Student Services Teachers from School Districts 5, 6 and 8 and community service members were trained on the PATH process. Promising Alternatives Towards Hope is a process that maps out the future for teens with developmental disabilities as their support teams plan for their transitions between schools and out to the community. The workshop was a cooperative venture with a company called Pivot Point.

Student Services Teachers have also begun a 4 session winter workshop series on data collection, IEP goal and objective writing and measurement of student progress. We have great talent in these areas in the district and those people are presenting the workshops to improve all of our skills and competency in these areas.

Update from the District Principal of Transformative Learning and Technology

We are in the beginning stages of testing the parent and student portal capabilities in My Education BC. There is a lot of set up and preparation that is required before we can go into production. The potential for continuously communicating student learning with this module is very exciting and will be a huge asset to our district. We will keep you posted!

Professional Development and In-services



Many teachers throughout our district are currently receiving training on the portal, Scholantis e-portfolios and coding. Ryan and Kim are booked regularly with individual teachers, small groups and full staffs.

Environmental Education

Many Schools in the District Participated in the "Get Outside Day on October 26. It was a great opportunity for teachers to take students outside and do some place based learning and have fun!



Class from KO participated in a great afternoon outside for Take Me Outside Day. The day involved an environmental circle song, discussions of how animals survive fires and a number of activities related to this. Even though it rained the entire time, this class learned, played and participated the entire time!



Coding- Train the Trainer


Reach a Reader Successful

Cranbrook *Reach a Reader* event was held in elementary schools on October 5th. Feedback received has been very positive and CBAL was able to raise awareness, as well as money, to promote literacy in Cranbrook. Alison Facey (our CBAL representative) witnessed firsthand the effect the Kootenay ICE players had on the students. She was surprised and impressed by how quiet and attentive the children were when the two players read Dean Smith's (former SD5 Band Teacher) book.

Making French Connections

SD5 has confirmed the possibility of forming a partnership with the school district of Nancy-Metz (in French: "l'académie de Nancy-Metz"). This school district is located in a beautiful region in Northern France and oversees about 405,000 students (the demographics of France are very different from ours: France has a population of about 66 million inhabitants and only 30 school districts). This international initiative will also be an opportunity to work closely with other BC school districts to support and promote education in French. The delegates from the school district of Nancy-Metz will be coming to BC in early December, and



Kindergarten Transition

The BC School Superintendents' Association is partnering with the Provincial Early Years' Office and Ministry of Education to develop and implement regional professional learning sessions that will bring together school district early learning leads, Kindergarten teachers and StrongStart BC facilitators with community-based partners (e.g., child-care operators, Child Development Centre staff, BC Early Years Centres, Aboriginal organizations and other early years providers). The purpose of the Regional Sessions on Early Years to Kindergarten Transitions:

- Establish a shared interest in understanding and working together to support improved Early Years to Kindergarten transitions
- Share ideas and expertise on innovative approaches to these transitions
- Share knowledge in respect to successful transitions for Aboriginal children and those children who are English Language Learners
- Ensure professional learning is drawing on the best evidence on improved transitions
- Create a provincial early learning network and support multi-sectorial community early years work.

First Step: Regional Early Years to Kindergarten Transitions Planning Meetings. The goal is to work with a regional planning team to



contextualize the January - June 2017 regional sessions and to have the opportunity to network with one another with a focus on seamless transitions for all children and families. A broad framework for the day has been designed and the regional planning team will ensure the needs, questions, and concerns of the region are reflected in the day's professional learning. The regional planning meeting includes Community Partners, Health Authorities, Success by 6 Regional Coordinators, School District leadership identified by Superintendents, Aboriginal Leadership and CDC leadership identified by the Provincial Office of the Early Years.

Update from Director of Student Learning and Aboriginal Education

Aboriginal Education

We had our initial meeting of our Enhancement Agreement Review Committee last week, and we were able to get some productive 'last minute' changes done to the draft agreement.

As well, Chief Joe Pierre Jr (I just like to write that!) and I have been visiting each school to discuss Aboriginal education programs, student success and embedding Aboriginal perspectives in the classroom. We visited nine schools this past few weeks, and have had some excellent conversations with our Principals and Aboriginal Education Support Workers.

Skills Training

The new Trades Sampler course is a go at Mount Baker, thanks to a grant obtained by our partners at COTR. MBSS will be able to offer this skills training course to a class of students this spring. As well, Brian Conrad and I were able to visit our three Elk Valley secondary schools to promote many skills training initiatives, including Ace-It, expanding the Elementary Skills Training program, and Trades Sampler courses.

Safe Schools Coordinator

This month we will be hosting training for ERASE VTRA Level I and II. This is the first time we have been able to conduct the training ourselves, as a number of us are now trainers. We have invited many of our community partners, including the RCMP, and look forward to a great few days!
