Diane Casault introduced ladies from the Distributed Learning Program run out of KDS at KOES and FLC in Fernie – Andrea Graham, Donna Cameron, Miriam Saville.

- Distributed Learning School for students K 12
- 60 different grade 10-12 courses
- Accommodate students that travel, sports etc.
- This is a way for parents to be the teacher to the student and we provide the support and curriculum
- Teacher responsible for approx. 20 different courses
- Emphasis is on flexible pacing.
- Offer courses to students that have not graduated and students wanting to upgrade.
- Find them on Learn Now BC
- All courses meet all learning outcomes in the irp's.
- Eases timetabling, improves graduation rate.
- Blended learning: The new Model is about blending both worlds online and traditional combine both.

- Can provide computers etc. Come in and work through the course.
- Statistics show that numbers are growing. 5 years ago much smaller, every year growing 2008-9, 60 FTE and latest 102 FTE
- Funding is available for internet. Activities as groups are ongoing.

2. BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

2.1. Website - Early, Middle and Late Intervention Services

Discussion included:

- website has been updated to show resources at all levels
- greater focus on resources in the early years (K-3) as research shows that support and resources at this level have the greatest benefit for students
- resources include literacy, as well as numeracy and social/emotional learning (whole child)
- services/resources are applied as soon as it is determined what a child needs

3. CORRESPONDENCE AND/OR NEW ITEMS

3.1. Caseload and Workload on Student Service Teachers

Discussion included:

- continue to review/resolve issues raised in the CFTA survey in 2012
- new 8 session training has been designed for new Student Service Teachers (Mr. Verbeurgt, Ms. Lindsay-Tadey, Miss Steele and Mrs. Anderson work together to help them understand the cultural and climate, what needs to be done and when, instructional support planning tools, planning EA schedules, supporting staff/parents, websites, IEP writing, etc.)
- feedback from teachers has been remarkable
- Could the survey be done again to see how we are improving the system? (Survey was conducted by the CFTA so we would have to check with them.)
- Trustees would like a report back to this committee (possibly a joint statement from CFTA and district) showing what issues from the CFTA survey have been resolved or continue to be worked on
- Trustee Brown is still hearing that some students do not attend school full days (These situations tend to be complex - a lot of work is done with these families. Students not attending full days are usually a cooperative agreement between parents and the school and are quite often a safety issue for the student and/or others.)
- roles and responsibilities of classroom teachers, Student Service Teachers and Education Assistants
- all Student Service teachers and Education Assistants have a copy of a
 document which outlines their roles/responsibilities (on website under Staff
 Resources (a link will be put on the Parent Resources site as well).
- an additional 25% will be added to LIF for next year (approx. \$800,000)
- Ministry Press Release regarding this additional funding does not mention teachers
- continue to work with teachers on an inclusion philosophy
- large responsibility to supervise and schedule Education Assistants (additional Education Assistants hired quite often requires additional time for Student Service Teacher)
- new IEPs are dated after September 30th (last year's carries over through the fall) to allow time students to settle and review
- trying to reduce unnecessary paperwork for Student Service Teachers
- hard to keep people in positions if FTE is not full time
- try to provide training opportunities to ensure they have the knowledge and skills required for the position
- satisfied people tend to stay in the job

- have completed exit interviews to learn about reasons for departure
- talk to our long term Student Service Teachers to see what the key things are that they really like about the job
- be proactive in the recruitment of existing classroom staff

Superintendent suggested a presentation from our school and district staff about the services we provide (for school age students on the Autism Spectrum), would make sense. Trustee Besanger asked for this to be added to the May committee meeting.

Purpose of this Report:

As the Board's Chief Executive Officer, the Superintendent of Schools is accountable for the day-to-day operations of the school district and for ensuring that the Board is aware of how the school district is doing in all areas of its operations.

Superintendent's Activities

School Organization

During the first week of March, school planning meetings were held with all principals. Considering the best enrolment information we have for each school along with the latest budget announcements from the Ministry of Education, preliminary decisions have been made regarding the staffing needs of each school. Brent Reimer and the Human Resources Department will begin the staffing process shortly so that we ensure the greatest stability possible for our schools in preparation for the 2014-2015 school year.

Learning Improvement Funds have been increased this year by 25% to \$795,136. This funding will be utilized in consultation and collaboration with schools and the Cranbrook/Fernie Teachers Association through conversations and recommendations on how to best meet the needs of students and reduce teacher workload.

ERASE Student Advisory and Student Voice

Nineteen BC students have been selected for the Provincial ERASE Student Advisory and will advise the Minister of Education and the Premier on bullying and other student safety issues, and will lead work on areas that they identify. Three interested students applied to be a part of this provincial committee. One student was too young and the other two students were not chosen. However, we salute their initiative.

The Student Advisory will have adult subject matter experts available to advise and guide them. The first area to explore will be on social media, and specifically provincial guidelines to help

use it ethically and responsibly. The Student Advisory group will be seeking input from all districts so our DSAC will still have an opportunity to be involved.

Meanwhile, 5 students attended the Provincial Student Voice Conference held April 4 & 5 in Vancouver. Students from Elkford and Fernie along with Keith Regular, Principal of Elkford Secondary School and Gail Rousseau, Executive Assistant attended the conference. Agenda items included a Question and Answer with the Minister of Education, Financial Literacy, Digital Citizen, A Deeper Understanding, Destination Imagination, Scholarships/Applications, and Life Beyond High School; Stories from the Field. Approximately 300 students participated from around the Province.

BC CASE Meetings

Darcy Verbeurgt, Nadine Steele, Maggie Lindsay-Tadey and I attended this year's BC CASE Meeting in Vancouver. The theme this year was "A Culture of Collective Responsibility". Teams from each district were encouraged to attend.

BC CASE's goal has been to help develop the realization that 'we' need to build a shared understanding of the problems we face, and complementary solutions that help develop great schools, and better outcomes for students.

The theme of this conference is to enhance our Culture of Collective Responsibility in providing the best schooling experience we can for all our children. We work together to enable our students to walk across the Graduation Stage with dignity and plan for the future. Our team's work is to help develop a shared understanding of the learning continuum, and as a system maximize our efforts to effect positive change.

International Choral Federation and Cranbrook School Choirs

On Saturday, April 12th, 2014 the International Choral Federation (ICF) will be performing two concerts in Cranbrook at the Alliance Church at 2:30 and 7:00 pm. The exciting news is that the local "guest choir" will be our very own student choirs from Cranbrook schools. ICF is made up of choirs from Leavenworth, Yakima, and Wenatchee in Washington, and Naramata, Trail and the Bisset Singers from Cranbrook, BC. The ICF concerts moves to each community every year and it is up to the local community to choose a feature guest. The Bisset Singers felt that this would be a fabulous opportunity for our students to perform with an adult mass choice and they have been most appreciative of the music teachers and administrators' support of this endeavor. The International Choral Festival has real potential to be a special memory in the students' lives.

SD5 Sports Teams

The 2013-2014 school year has been another successful year for our teams. A considerable number of staff members and community volunteers continue to support our students in their athletic pursuits and I extend sincere appreciation for the time and expertise which is dedicated

to enable our students to learn and grow from this involvement. Congratulations to all of our student athletes!

Update from the Director of Instruction/Human Resources

Staffing processes for the coming school year are under way with final budgetary decisions being made in the next few weeks. Any necessary district initiated transfers of continuing teaching staff to meet budgetary requirements will occur after final decisions are determined. In addition, continuing teacher initiated transfer requests will be considered prior to the post and fill process for next year's available teaching positions.

CUPE staffing processes will begin in the latter part of May and will continue through the summer as required.

We continue to advertise for TTOC positions on going and for the next school year. TTOC applicants with specialties in French Immersion, Student Services, Industrial Education and Counselling will be given special consideration.

Update from the District Principal of Student Services

Along with several alternate education staff and principals from SD5, Darcy Verbeurgt attended the Alternate Education Conference in Vancouver. They came back with affirmations that we are doing many things right in our programs. We also picked up a couple of ideas to work on.

Darcy also attended a POPEI (Provincial Outreach Program – Early Intervention) directors meeting in February. In its infancy, we are expecting a great network of sharing to develop across the province to improve early intervention in the Primary years.

Several planning meetings, website development and spring break occupied much of March. Darcy will be attending a mental health promotion and prevention meeting in Fernie, as well as a collaborative session focusing on the improvement of mental illness services in the East Kootenys. The Regional Science Fair is on April 11 and 12 at the College of the Rockies.

CAPITAL PROJECT BYLAW – PROJECT NO. 126739 ANNUAL FACILITY GRANT

A BYLAW by the Board of Education of School District No. 5 (Southeast Kootenay) (hereinafter called the "Board") to adopt a Capital Project.

WHEREAS in accordance with provisions of the *School Act*, the Minister of Education (hereinafter called the "Minister") has approved a capital plan of the Board.

NOW THEREFORE the Board agrees to the following:

- a) upon approval to proceed, commence the Project and proceed diligently and use its best efforts to complete the project substantially in accordance with the Project Agreement (where required);
- b) observe and comply with any rule, policy or regulation of the Minister as may be applicable to the Board or the Project; and,
- c) maintain proper books of account, and other information and documents with respect to the affairs of the Project, as may be prescribed by the Minister.

NOW THEREFORE the Board enacts as follows:

- 1. The capital project of the Board approved by the Minister and specifying a maximum expenditure of \$1,124,996 for Project No.126739 is hereby adopted.
- 2. This bylaw may be cited as "School District No. 5 (Southeast Kootenay) Capital Project Bylaw 126739".
