1.7 Receiving of Delegations/Presentations

1.7.1 Sexuality & Gender Differentiating - Robin Hansom

Superintendent Hauptman introduced Robin Hansom who has traveled from Elkford to speak on Sexuality and Gender Differentiating. Robin is

an Elkford Secondary student and wanted to share some of her story with the Board of Education.

Key point were:

- when people think sex they think gender.
- first thing announced to the world is male or female.
- pink or blue.
- not everyone falls into this.
- as a student it is difficult to teach your peers.

Discussion included:

- share the knowledge that you can be anything.
- bathrooms and change rooms that are gender neutral.
- discussions with our teaching staff.

Superintendent Hauptman thanked Robin for sharing her story and reported that this topic is growing within the schools and there has been discussion with the PVP's regarding Sexuality & Gender Differentiating.

1.7.2 Buddy Benches

Ms. Casault introduced Jeremy and Jessica Marusyk from First Call Contracting. Mr. Marusyk explained they would like to donate Buddy Benches to all the schools. The family feels this is a way to give back to schools and to help prevent bullying. Companies along with theirs that have already signed up to help with this project include:

Mr. Marusyk mentioned that they would like to see the students from the schools get involved with the finishing of the benches.

The Board discussed sending a thank you to all those involved once the project is complete.

Ms. Casault introduced Michelle Sartorel, principal of Gordon Terrace Elementary School. Ms. Sartorel reported Gordon Terrace has been the recipient of a Buddy Bench thanks to Mr. Knipe's adaptive technology class at MBSS. She explained that it has been a wonderful addition to the school yard and she personally has witnessed the benefits. These benefits include:

- a place for students to go when feeling left out.
- a place for students to go when needing a friend.
- a place to go when being bullied, lets other students know they need support.
- a bench were students can look out for each other.

Ms. Sartorel told the Board it is the responsibility as educators to make everyone own a piece of wanting to make the world a better place. She and her staff have been using literature in the classrooms to pass this message along to their students.

This school year, the International Education Program of School District 5 will host a total of 77 students, mostly from our main markets of Germany (30), Mexico (16), Brazil (12), Spain (6), Japan (3) and Switzerland (2). We're also delighted to welcome our first-ever students from Russia (2) and, still to come, India (1) and China (1)!

A highlight for the Program this year is that six students have been enjoying their time in our schools and communities so much that they have decided to extend their stays, mostly for an additional semester. Many others would have liked to extend their stays if they could have. Factors that contribute to their positive experience here are caring host families, new friends and our excellent education system that Canadians often take for granted. Some of the most common comments we hear from students are how friendly and helpful our teachers are and how great it is to choose from a wide range of interesting electives that are not offered in their home countries. Students also enjoy skiing and snowboarding, our beautiful scenery, the safety of our small communities and the exciting adventure activities that the International Program provides. This year students have already visited Scarywood for Halloween and have been hiking and canoeing in Banff, river rafting on the Elk River, skating, and have taken ski and snowboard lessons to prepare for the ski season.

Our hope for every international student is that they make Canadian friends and integrate well into our schools. Perhaps more than any other year, our students are doing just that! Four international students played important roles in the MBSS theatre production of The Optimist and several students are playing in bands, singing in choirs, swimming on the swim team and playing on various sports teams such as soccer, volleyball and basketball.

A special thank you to all the teachers, host families, staff, coaches and volunteers who help to give our international students "the best time of their lives"!







Update from the Director of Instruction/Human Resources

Staffing for the current school year continues for secondary schools as second semester blocks have been posted and are in the process of being filled. To date there have been just over 150 teacher postings and 150 CUPE postings for the 2015-2016 school year.

The District will be having a Joint Occupational Health and Safety (JOHS) training session for all school reps on those committees in late January. This training will allow each school to have the necessary tools/processes/ procedures to properly function as a JOHS committee at each school/district site. These committees are necessary under the WSBC regulations which in turn allows School District 5 to operate in a safe manner for all of its employees.

Technology Update

Roll-Out

The IBM conversion at Jaffray is now complete. The remaining five schools: Amy Woodland, Pinewood, Gordon Terrace, Steeples and Frank J. Mitchell are scheduled for conversion between January and March.

Hour of Code

Several schools in School District No. 5 participated in the "Hour of Code" during the week of December 7 to 13, 2015. Students were given the opportunity to experience computer coding in a hands on, fun and interactive environment! Students were communicating, problem solving, analyzing and were quickly immersed in computer coding activities.

Some of the comments I heard while wandering around were:


"So cool"

Update from the Director of Student Learning and Innovation

CR4YR Changing Results for Young Readers has continued this year with two parallel groups: CR4YR (primary facilitator Carol Johns) CR4AR (middle/secondary facilitator Deb Kennedy). Sessions will revisit the intellectual underpinnings which frame CR4YR. Some of this year's inquiry questions include:

- Can blogging be a means to promote more engaged writing, especially in regards to reluctant writers, and in this case, in reference to a communal novel study
- If I conduct individual oral reading sessions, where I am listening to students reading passages from their silent reading novels and coaching them through strategies, will reading fluency improve? And ultimately will reading comprehension improve?
- By creating a supportive learning environment, focusing on a big idea, and teaching explicit literacy strategies, will students' competence, engagement, and achievement improve?

Counsellors' working group continues to meet on a regular basis with several meetings scheduled throughout the year. The majority of our counselling staff were able to access the Assist Training held in Fernie last April. For those who missed the opportunity, SD 6 has invited us to participate in their Assist Training day in early April. One of our next projects include the completion of the SD 5 Counsellors' Handbook as well as a thorough review of our District's Crisis Response Plan and the District Response Team.

My Education BC Update:

Currently all classroom teachers have been trained in the fundamentals as well as on the reporting functionality of MyEd. Assessment and reporting discussions continue with teacher representation from SD 5 on the provincial working group.

Next steps include:

- continued support for the counselling group who are responsible for reviewing students' graduation verification and eligibility
- Training of Student Services Teachers
- Training of Support staff (YCW, AESW, EA and Itinerants)
- Bussing/transportation
- next year scheduling



Finance/Operations Update:

- December was a busy month for Payroll as they had an early month end pay on the last school day in the Month.
- Final funding documents will arrive mid December and the final budget for 15/16 will be completed.
- Working on the details of a 3 year school calendar in compliance with Ministry Regulations.
- 4 new capital projects underway including Laurie Middle school reconstruction. Progress is good on the LMS site.
- Enrolment projections are underway for the 16/17 school year budget preparation.
 School planning sessions are scheduled for the week of Feb 29th.



Update from the Director of Student Learning/ Aboriginal Education

Aboriginal Education

The ministry of Education has released the yearly 'How Are We Doing? report on Aboriginal student achievement. The Aboriginal graduation rate in SD 5 continues to rise, and we are starting to see very little difference in the graduation rates between Aboriginal and Non-Aboriginal students. There will be further details in our Annual Report on the Enhancement Agreement next month.

Skills Training

Plans are well underway for this school year's Project Heavy Duty. Dates have been selected for this year's program, hosted in Cranbrook. Thanks to all the organizers who are putting so many hours into this important opportunity!
