JERRY'S STORY

The original Jerry - an orphaned baby moose - first visited a BC Park in the 1960s when a rancher found the young moose and adopted him. The orphaned moose had an affinity for people. He would come when his name was called and patiently stood still while adults and children would pet his muzzle. Park rangers in nearby Wells Grey Provincial Park heard about the moose and recognized the value of using him to educate kids about conservation. Jerry was relocated permanently to the park and cared for by the rangers.



The original Jerry has long since retired but his legacy lives on. In 1986, the 75th anniversary of BC Parks, the Jerry the Moose character became the official BC Parks mascot. Jerry welcomed visitors from around the world at the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games in Vancouver and he continues to be a presence around B.C.'s parks and protected areas.

Who are Jerry's Jr Rangers?
