- Attended the BCCPAC Board of Directors Emergency Parent Leader Strategic Planning Session that focussed on the Classroom Resource Framework
- Visited teacher picket lines to help build local relationships and to gain a better understanding of teacher issues
- Accepted an invitation to the Cranbrook and District Teacher Association Executive meeting to further build this relationship and to help explain the roles of PAC and DPAC
- Provided parent questions to Trustee Candidates to help parents garner a better understanding and perspective for each candidate running for Trustee

- Approved a request and creation of the DPAC District Traffic Safety Committee that brings district staff, Trustee liaison(s) and concerned parents together over district wide safety issues
- Approved a funding request from our SD5 District Student Advisory Council (DSAC) to help aid and encourage our student leaders
- Provided a letter of support for our Board to Prime Minister Harper re: The Voluntary National Household Survey (V-NHA) aka long form census form. The information that this form supplied, directly affects the Community Link funding our district receives for vulnerable students

- Participated in a conference call with BCCPAC Board members and various DPAC Chairs/members to discuss continued communication between BCCPAC and member DPACs as well as a new format for the BCCPAC Fall Conference.
- Proposed an education partner group meeting with our MLA Bill Bennett to discuss what the group sees as our top three district concerns

- Invited to and attended the Curriculum and Learning Workshop hosted jointly by SD5/Pro D Committee
- All PAC's receive and are encouraged to supply parent feed-back via DPAC/Thought-stream on all SD5 policies
- Monthly representation at the District's Advocacy, Education Policy and public portion of the Finance and Operations Standing Committee meetings
